
OTTAWA, 14th February, 1906.

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 12th instant, relative to trespass made on Badgley Island, I beg to inform you that the Indian Agent at Manitowaning wrote this Department under date of 16th January and stated that the Forest Bailiff found it utterly impossible to get to the Island, owing to the very unsafe condition of the ice, as the season had been very mild there and ice travel very dangerous.

He also stated that as soon as weather permitted, the necessary examination would be made.
