
Ottawa, April 7, 1919.

Gentlemen,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letters of the 26th ultimo and 1st instant, in regard to the N. $\frac{1}{2}$ of sec. 19, Tp. 20, Rge. 17, W. 2nd M. In reply I beg to say that the Department is prepared to accept the transfer from James Harold Wallis to Erith F. H. Hoyer of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 19, upon the understanding that the arrears of principal and interest, as indicated in your letter, are paid, upon receipt of which Letters Patent will be issued to Mr. Hoyer.

As regards the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 19, I would point out that the sale of this property to Mr. McDougall has been cancelled, and as Mr. Horn, a returned soldier, has parted with his interest therein, the Department is not disposed to consider the question of transfer to Mr. Hoyer. The relinquishments from William Horn forwarded under cover of your letter of the 1st instant, are herewith returned.
