to the Medical Board of Quebec.
D^r. That he underwent an Examination
and answered the Questions satisfac-
tory.
- D^r. That the Members observed that
they had come to a resolution of admit-
ting no Candidate to pass their Board
who had not been at a University.
D^r. That he was advised to apply to
an American University.
- D^r. That, after which, the M^r. Board
would grant the necessary Certificate,
by which he is to obtain his Licence.
- Which is proved by the Certificate
signed by Robert and Wolfred Nelson
which is proved by a Reference signed
J. Ready, dated Quebec 6 Oct. 1820.
Which is proved by a letter written
by Dr. Holmes, dated Quebec, No^o 17
1820. Which letter states that he
was examined, and "that his answers
to the several Questions were very credit-
able to him, uniting his opportunities
His opportunities have been equal to those
of any Candidate who has ever passed
the Medical Boards.
Which is proved by the above mentioned
letter of Dr. Holmes, the President,
and also by another written by Dr. Lloyd,
which can be produced if required.
Which is proved by the following state-
ment of Dr. Holmes "that not far off
there was a College; the shortest
road to which is to be taken at three
Pains." Dartmouth College is here im-
plied.
This was distinctly stated to him at the
close of the Examination by Dr. Holmes,
and is proved by the above mentioned
letter of Dr. Lloyd.
