Mines and Technical Surveys; new deposit of iron ore

80. The Minister of Mines and Technical Surveys mentioned that magnetometer surveys indicated the existence of a new and very promising iron ore deposit at Larder Lake. An announcement was being made.

81. The Cabinet noted the report of the Minister of Mines and Technical Surveys concerning indications of an iron ore deposit at Larder Lake, Ontario.

1950 apple crop; assistance to growers

82. The Minister of Agriculture, referring to the discussion at the meeting of September 26th, 1951, recommended that, in respect of the 1950 apple crop, assistance be given to British Columbia growers to the extent of 15 cents per bushel on slightly more than 8 million bushels of graded apples, at a cost of \$1.2 million, and to Nova Scotia growers to the extent of 25 cents per bushel (75 cents per barrel) on approximately 1.2 million bushels of graded apples at a cost of \$300,000; on the understanding that the Department of Agriculture would pay these sums to British Columbia Tree Fruits Limited and the Nova Scotia Apple Marketing Board respectively, for distribution on an appropriate basis to growers making deliveries to them.

An explanatory memorandum had been circulated.

83. The Cabinet, after considerable discussion:

(a) approved the recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture that, with respect to the 1950 apple crop, assistance be given to British Columbia growers to the extent of 15 cents per bushel on slightly more than 8 million bushels of graded apples, at a cost
