1843. R. F. Gourlay to Neilson. Sends a volume and a paper. Remarks on reports of committees of Assembly and of Council. His health.

1844. J. Neilson to R. F. Gourlay. (Draft). Explaining the action of the Government respecting Gourlay's case, and suggesting a mode of approaching the Government again.

1844. R. F. Gourlay to Neilson. Acknowledgment and thanks for letter, which he has printed.
- Wednesday,  
10th July,  
1844. E. Glackemeyer to Neilson. (In French). Asking Neilson to introduce him to Robert Baldwin.

27th Novr.,  
1844. J. C. Fisher to Neilson. Committee of Correspondence on Halifax and Quebec Railway desire Neilson to prepare an address to the people of Canada, advocating the building of Railway.
- Quebec,  
29th Novr.,  
1844. J. Neilson to D. Daly. (Draft). Desires to know Governor's intentions respecting petition from Quebec Mechanics Institute for use of chemical apparatus imported for the Normal School; also asking that they be allowed the use of apartments in the Legislative buildings, or the Bishop's palace.

1845. J. Languedoc to Neilson. Stating that, in the event of a new Militia Bill cancelling existing commissions, he desires not to be overlooked in the reorganization.
- St. Antoine  
de Tilly,  
17th Febru-  
ary, 1845. J. P. J. Noel to Neilson. Asking his consideration of certain petitions, one for the annexation of the parish of St. Nicholas to the county of Lotbiniere; the other for the removal of the Registry Office of Lotbiniere to St. Antoine.
