

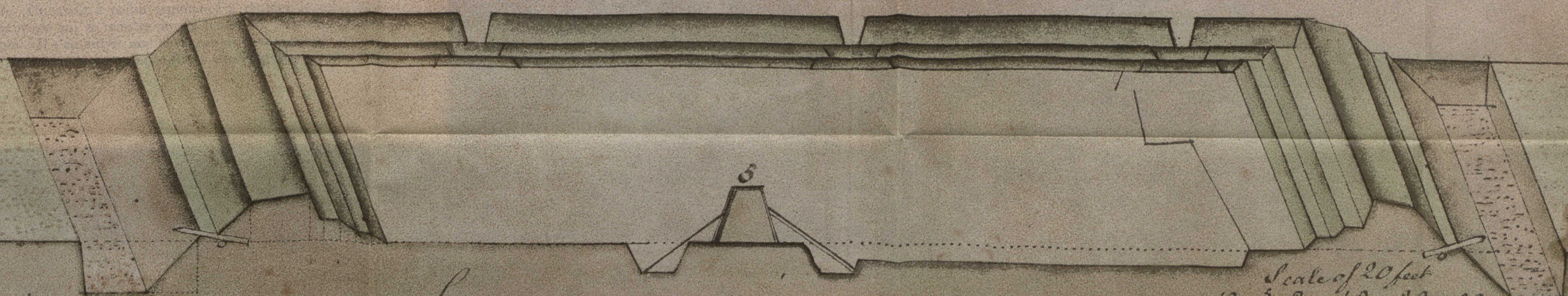
Plan of the Two Redouts

Sorrelle in the Province of *Quebec*
 in the Summer 1776, such as they were
 intended had the Camparts been entirely
 completed, in thickness & Lodging

References to the South Redout
 C. A Bake House with a Guard House for a Liejants Party built in the year 1770, but now
 that Guard House became the Guard House for the Officers & the Mess Room for those of the 26th Reg.
 as long as it was tenible. D. Shed built for a Store House covered only with single Boards, it & the
 Bake House became the New Guard House during the Siege. F. A Shed behind the Guard House
 for Stores and the Engineers Quarters. G. Another for the Canadians. H. the Powder Magazine & Store
 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7. Traverses against the Enemies Shot. This Redout had 16 Pieces of Cannon Mounted
 Besides a 10 Inch Mortar & some Royals. & would have admitted more.

References to North Redout.
 E. A large Store House with vaulted Cellars, Two Stories above them, with
 Garrets Where the Men & Officers of Duty were lodged during the Enemy's
 Cannonade & Bombardment. The Vault where powder was lodged was
 covered with three feet thick of logs & as much earth over that to break the
 force of Shells. This House was built by Col. Christy on the Kings Ground.
 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8. Traverses covered with wood, or canvas to cover
 the Parade from the Enemy's, but in the Order of the Figures.
 2, 2, 2. Impiafures intended but not opened.
 1. The Shipbuilder & Commodore's Huts, after the Fleet was sunk
 or destroyed without engaging the Enemy's Vessels.

N.B. In Order to find Earth for the Chagewes, we were obliged
 to sink the Parades in both Redouts, in the South Redout which
 was the smallest, the Earth in general was dug out to within a
 foot of the Water, and before the Chagewes, & even below the Water.
 The Pennsylvania Gazette of the 1st Novr 1776 says that Elijah
 Cable of Connecticut examined by the Provincial Congress
 said that on 1st of the Month the Enemy before John were about
 1000, and that Captain Quackenbush arrived from John confirms
 the above Account. Supposing this true. They ought to have swallowed up the
 small Detachment of the 26th Regiments in these Redouts, and not
 have waited so long to reduce them by Famine, but they did not feel bold
 enough to Storm, when their Number was ten to One in the Garrison nearly
