THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manteba er the North-West Territorics, excepting 8 and 25, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to p-wide wood lots for cettlens, or for other purposes, may be homeweaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of ags, to the artent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

Butry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is altuate. HOMESTEAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an eatry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or motiler, if the father is deceased) of the home-cader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person re-dding with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a secon! homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those setti-re only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistant in securing land to suit there. Full information respecting the land timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands it the Railway Belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
