Pius X's First Encyclical

Declares He Accepted the Pontificate With Reluctance. Rome, Oct. 3.—The first encyclical of Pope Pius X. is published to-day.

The encyclical urges the co-operation of the bishops in re-establishing the empire of Christ on earth and enjoins them to maintain intact the dogmas of the sanctity of the marriage tie and the duty of peoples toward rulers who hold power solely from God.

The most important and interesting part is as follows: "We proclaim that we have not in the supreme pontificate any other programme than to gather all things in Christ so that Christ shall be all in all.

His Holiness declares that obedience to the laws and submission to the government are the duty of all citizens. The encyclical closes thus: "It is evident that the Church, instituted by Christ, must enjoy full and entire independence."

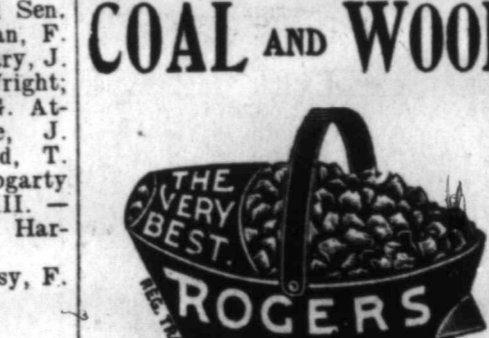
