MR. HUDSON'S AYRSHIRES

A breeder of pure bred Ayrshires who has some very nice producing stock is Mr. James Hudson of Lynn, Ont. Mr. Hudson has been breeding Ayrshires in this country for 18 years. He was first in the business in Scotland, where his father was an Ayrshire breeder. Mr. Hudson's herd consists of 20 head of pure bred animals containing some of the best producing blood of the breed. One of his sons, Bridge Grove, from April 4 to April 30 gave 1,021 lbs. of 3.7 milk. In May she gave as high as 50 lbs. in 30 days. Her average, averaged 28 lbs. a day of 5.4 milk with her first calf. Another heifer, Ruth, having in her the blood of Primrose of Tanglewyld, the world's champion Ayrshire cow, gave over 1,000 lbs. of milk as a four-year-old. The herd bull also has a good percentage of the blood of Primrose of Tanglewyld.

Mr. Hudson's cows are persistent milkers. He goes to the point of performance work and we shall hear more of him in the future.

MR. LAITHWAITE EXPLAINS

Editor, Farm and Dairy.—I must thank Mr. E. Laidlaw & Son for calling our attention to the oversight in Farm and Dairy in publishing the article in which I give 13 of the highest yearly records of our four dairy breeds.
