PRAYERS.

A Message was brought from the House of Assembly, by Mr. Whidden, with the following Resolution.

Resolved, That the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds be granted for the service of Roads and Bridges for the present year: which was read a first time. £10,000 Roads and Bridges

The Lord Bishop, pursuant to leave given, brought in a Bill, to be entitled, An Act to provide for the preservation of the Peace in the Townships and Settlements wherein no Justice of the Peace resides: which was read a first time. Preservation of Peace Bill

Ordered, That the Bill, entitled, An Act relating to Passengers from Great-Britain and Ireland arriving in this Province, be referred to a Committee of the whole House presently—the House was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee on the said Bill,—after some time the House was resumed, and Mr. Jeffery reported that the Committee had agreed to the said Bill with amendments. Passengers Bill committed Reported with amendments

The amendments were then read and agreed to.

Ordered, That the Deputy-Clerk do carry the said Bill and amendments to the House of Assembly, and desire their concurrence to the said amendments. Amendments agreed to and sent to House of Assembly
