The English general news is of trifling

interest. It is confidently asse-ated that

the Chancellor would have a surplus of

not less than £400,000 for the year.

Public expectation is strongly in favor

of a large reduction in taxation

The Baltic ship Franconia was wrecked

off Holyhead on the 11th ult. The Cap-

tain and eleven hands were lost, together

with her cargo of tobacco.

A slight sensation has been created by

the recent appointment, without any pre-

vious notice of a new Roman Catholic

Bishop for Ireland.

The London Standard states that Lord

John Russell firmly adheres to the princi-

ples laid down in his letter to the Bishops.

London is said to be rapidly filling up

with all kinds of adventurers for the forth-

coming season.

It is stated, on the authority of the Earl

Monteagle, that the British Government

has resolved to make Holyhead the port

of arrival and departure for the trans-At-

lantic Mail Steamers.

FRANCE.

Louis Napoleon appears to have gained,

for the time being, a complete mastery

over General Changarnier. An unquiet

feeling pervaded all classes in Paris on

Thursday, and the Assembly was crowded

has been resolved upon. The army of

the Duchies has been disbanded, and the

chief members of the Stadtholde have

retired to Hamburg; although nothing

definite is known of the proceedings of the

Dresden Conference, yet little doubt ap-

pears to be entertained that the result will

be a reconciliation.

The Austrian project of a Zollverein

was the chief subject for discussion at the

last dates. It meets with no favor from

the Government of Prussia; but the Gov-

ernments of Saxony and Bavaria are said

to favor it.

M Manteuffel has announced it as being

the intention of Government to abolish a

monopoly which a few families have en-

joyed, of filling minor offices of State, and

that merit and administrative ability will

hereafter form the chief test of filling all

Government offices.

The Prussian Government have resolv-

upon the express imposition of a high in-

come tax limited to yield \$2,000,000 and

to be applied to the payment of the interest

of the public debt contracted in 1848.

SPAIN.

Another weekly resignation of the Span-

ish Cabinet has taken place, and this time

it is said that Narvaez has actually left

Madrid. Accounts from Rome and the

Papal States report a growing apprehen-

sion and uneasiness among all classes.

INDIA AND CHINA.

The overland mail arrived on Monday.

The whole of India was tranquil. The

negotiations relative to Calcutta have come

to a stand still.

Java was quiet, but piracies continue.

The export market at Calcutta was brisk

on the 7th December. The prospects of

harvest was cheering. Indigo and Sugar

have advanced; Saltpetre and raw Silk

are firm.

BUENOS AYRES.

The British Packet of Dec. 12, from

Buenos Ayres, says that the Finances of

the country are in a creditable condition,

with a considerable surplus on hand.—
