Potter brought it up in connection with the resolution of the Council passed some time ago, empowering him to advertise for tenders for a life saving apparatus to be placed at a convenient spot along the river bank.

"A resolution was passed during the present year," he said, "empowering me to advertise for tenders for a life saving apparatus for the river, to be used in connection with drowning accidents. I think the great need for such appliances has been brought home to every one of us this afternoon in the sad accident which happened. I am not prepared to say that it would have been of any material assistance in the scase, but the need is fecognized by every citizen.

"I have been asked this afternoon why I Sid not press the matter stronger while I had it in hand, and I thought it only fair to myself to explain the condition of affairs at present.
