These are the Apricots planted on a Southern and fruited very sparingly last year. I think this may be attributed to seasonable plowing. The Japanese are on a northern slope but are on the southern side of the white abundance of partially unfripped buds are on the north side. Old dry air of this week is unfavorable. It is interesting to see the Russian and Japan trees in blossom. This point has been at Corwell Station by starting of the Golden Rod and other at the low temperature of 32 through the summer until pushed out their shoots at their usual time and later it may be added the following winter in the house.
