Apple Shipments.

The Halifax Herald of Monday says—Apple shipments approximating twenty thousand barrels were taken away from Halifax over the week-end by two liners bound over the Atlantic to the old country. To load the first 1913 consignment of Nova Scotia apples for the Scottish market the Allan liner Parisian made a special call from Boston. She sailed again yesterday having embarked about ten thousand barrels. The other exports were in the cargo of the Warren line's Sagamore which left Liverpool with a like amount. The Parisian embarked fourteen passengers at Halifax and the Sagamore two.
