From New York Sun, Aug. The ship "E. J. Spicer," laden with petroleum, dropped down the East Rive early yesterday morning, and anchoff Ellis Island. She waited for her co

The ship "E. J. Spicer." laden with petroleum, dropped down the East River early yesterday morning. and anchored of Ellis Island. She waited for her clearance papera, and was to have sailed for London ta-day.

The crew was net complete. A boatswain and three man had shipped on her before she left her berth in the East River, but she was short-handed, and four more men were sent out to her about noon. Among them were Patrick O'Creay, of Montreal, and George Richmond, who had been picked up in this city.

The men went at once into the forecastle to change their clothes, when the first mate, Daniel C. Spicer, called down somewhat gruffly for them to hurry up and come on deck. According to the account of Edward Fish, the cabin boy, O'Creay, who appeared to be just recovering from the effects of a spree, made answer to the mate, demanding to know who he was anyway, and insisting that he was as good a man as the mate, coupled with the information that he was mate of the ship.

Then, says the cabin boy, the mate sprang at the sailor as he came useless, and then it was that O'Creay drew his sprang at the sailor as he came useless, and then it was that O'Creay drew his sheath knife from his belt and forced the whole blade into Spicer's left breast.
