Few racing men would suspect that, legally speaking, Red Walker is a Canadian farmer. It came out yesterday when objection was made to his horse Stanley Fay starting in the race of horses owned by Canadians that he was born in this country and that he makes his home on a farm near Toronto.

Willie Hammond, the local apprentice, came in for a lot of praise yesterday for his ride on King Holladay, one of the worst actors at the track. Hammond, after being thrown by the horse, remounted without showing any sign of fear and he finished a long up third. Had not the horse run away before the start he would likely have won the race. King Holladay threw several boys at Montreal and some of the jockeys would not ride him at any price.

Lawson Robertson, the new trainer of the New York Irish-American A. C., has struck not a new but a true key when he says the trouble these days is that the schoolboy athletes are worked so hard when taken into the ranks of the larger clubs that they "burn up" before their time.

You will notice this is true. The youngsters are urged to do their best so often that they run themselves out. Athletics then become injurious instead of helpful.

In the heat of competition rival organizations and rival athletes are taxed to their utmost. The outcome of one event might decide which club will win the meet. The excitement is intense and the exertion on the part of the contestants is greater. Imagine a lad just out of school pitted against older, stronger and more seasoned athletes and trying to beat them out.

And from this and other things it looks as if the ex-amateur cracker sprinter is going to make a success as a trainer.

Writing in the Buffalo Times, Joe Gans says:

"My knockout of Frank Erne was the quickest change of championships on record. I had that battle at Fort Erie planned to an inch—both my end and Frank's. For nights before the fight I lay in bed thinking out Erne's moves and figuring how I could catch him. Some fellows will lack one step or two steps or three steps when they give ground. Erne, when he went back from a fight, would only a certain number of inches, and then start forward again. I planned to meet him immediately, fight with him, and as he drew back to a certain position, hook my right hand over to the spot where he would be. I could have followed my schedule with my eyes shut and put him out, for he did exactly what I had figured on. We fought. Erne drew back just so far and stopped. I was following him, and my right hand had already started when he stopped and bobbed his head back right into the blow. He was out for several minutes."

It was Alf Shrub's time to quit in his race with Longboat the Indian, for on Saturday night with a full lap to his credit in the fifteenth mile of a twenty mile race, he limped so badly that he stopped, finally quitting the track. He was an odds on favorite in the betting. If these Marathon runners keep on quitting in races that people give up their good money to bet on, it is only a question of a few weeks time when the Marathoners will be running for less than the leather medals they received a few years ago as amateurs. Not one single one of these Big Fellows of the game but has at one time or another quit in a match race.

Bobby Kerr was beaten by Cartmel in 10 to 5 odds on Saturday, which is about two-fifths slower than Bobby goes when he is near right. The Canadian Thunderbolt should be better than that when he meets Walker the Springbok.

"Hotspur" McBride writes in the Buffalo Enquirer:

"Did you ever stop and note the manner in which baseball, boxing and football injuries are played up in some of the newspapers? I saw some one killed in a baseball game and the news is heralded on the front pages of the yellows in scare heads. When a football player dies of pneumonia he is jerked into top of column. I pass with cuts, and the football idea is the keynote of the story, and if a boxer or an alleged boxer, should be injured at once the floodgates of invective are opened against this sport.

Five laborers can be killed by the cave-in of a sewer. A horse and a worker drop 200 feet and muss up the pavement, and the story captures the festive 'full-face' head on inside pages. This is the way in which sport gets its eyes blackened. One Chicago newspaper has a ghoulish who every year delves through the records of the dead and injured list in football and basketball, and fails to record in so loud a voice that yachting, swimming, polo, lacrosse, pugilism and half a hundred other sports have casualty lists that make football look like the pink tea game by comparison.

No one denies that there is a certain element of danger in all sports, but why should football and baseball be continually singled out for the loud howling headlines by the yellow kinds of the publishing geschäft?

TOURENNE WAS FIRST.

Stanley Fay 1 to 2 Was
BeatenIn the Canadian Handicap
Yesterday.Another Large Crowd at
the H. J. C.

The talent fared better yesterday at the Hamilton Jockey Club track than on any day of the present meet, four favorites finishing first. Two long shots, Tourenne and Andrew Summers, won. The crowd was large and the racing good. A new turf record was made in the last race by Lady Esther and in winning the Canadian Handicap, Tourenne came within a fifth of a second of equalling the track record for a mile and an eighth made by Caye Adam last year. Lady Esther's time for the mile and a sixth on the grass was 1:45 3-5, a fifth better than the record, which was held by St. Illario. Tourenne's time was 1:33 2-5.

Although there were only three starters in the handicap for Canadian owned horses, this was about the longest race of the meeting and one blanket could have covered two of the horses at any stage of the route and it would have covered three of them for most of the journey. Objection taken to the admission of Stanley Fay was the cause of several of the scratches in this race. Tourenne and St. Elwood stayed in, and both of them beat the Walker champion. Stanley Fay carried top weight, 126 pounds, but the handicap was entirely disregarded by the prize-makers, who had him a 1 to 2 chance, and paid 5 to 5 against the other two coupled. Mantry's ill-judged riding of the favorite helped to compass his defeat. The three ran head and head for half a mile, and the first five furlongs were done in about a minute. Reid, on Tourenne, realized that such pace would be fatal to the top weight, and took back. The other two paced around the top bend, and Tourenne moved up again. At the head of the stretch he got a chance to come through on the rail, and shouldered the others out. The drive to the finish was a close one, and Tourenne won it by a neck from St. Elwood. The favorite weakened at the critical point after so fast a pace under big weight. Stanley Fay was held at 1 to 2 and the "field" sold at 3 to 2.
