Notice is hereby given that an application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, at the next session thereof for an Act to amend the Act passed in the 30th year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 74, and the Act amending the said Act, passed in the 32nd year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 31, incorporating the St. Marys, Credit Valley and Huron Railway Company by extending the line of the commencement and completion of said Railway; and by authorizing the construction of said Railway to Goderich; and also to Seize, and thence to some point on Lake Huron, also to enable the company to compel the submission of any by-law or by-laws that may be petitioned for by the required number of freeholders in any municipality or portion of a municipality; and also to exempt the said company and all municipalities voting thereto from the provisions of the 34th section of an Act passed in the 32nd year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 31, and of the 36th section of an Act passed in the 33rd year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 27; also to enlarge the powers of the Directors of the said Company in building the said road, and to enable them to issue mortgage bonds for that purpose, and to enable the municipalities aiding said railway to issue bonds or debentures having a longer period than 30 years to run, and providing for the payment thereof either by instalments, or by way of a sinking fund.
