The last committee of all to adjourn was that on superannuation matters, which met in the King Street Methodist Church. The proceedings were not characterized by very fierce debate, one reason why, doubtless, being the fact that the most dainty morsels of debate on which there is great divergence of opinion were held over for a future meeting. The proposed new constitution of the superannuation fund was under discussion and was practically adopted. The points on which there is a difference of opinion, and which have yet to be argued, relate to the mode in which circuit contributions shall be levied and the basis of ministerial subscriptions. The new constitution is based on the Australian and American systems and the most important item of difference from the present constitution is the departure in the matter of refunds. By the paragraphs accepted in committee this morning all subscriptions will be refunded to members ceasing their connection with the church, whether they do so voluntarily

or for the church's good. The committee on Sabbath observance have instructed their secretary to draw up the report to be presented to the confer-

ence. This afternoon and evening will be devoted to further committee work, with the extention of a short session of the conference at 5 o'clock. Three hundred and ninety-six delegates, wives and friends have registered so far. By reaching the 300 mark they are entitled to a free re-
