THE JOYOUS HOME-COMING

Of London Lads Who Fought for the Dear Old Flag in South Africa.

Thousands of Enthusiastic Citizens Turn Out to Welcome the Brave Boys-The Streets Packed With People All Along the Line of March--A Continuous Hurricane of Cheers Greets the Heroes--The Thanksgiving Service--Names of Returned Soldiers--Interviews With Col. Buchan and Other Members of the Company.

London's whole heart was in yesterday's welcome to her twenty-one glad-hearted, healthy and bronzed sons, who returned home as veterans of the South African war.

At Ingersoll the soldiers who had already returned, met their former comrades. No crowd of schoolboys were ever more hilariously happy than they.

A PLEASANT SURPRISE. At Ingersoll there was another pleasant and truly welcome surprise. The dainty baskets containing tasty lunches, that had been sent at Col. Stacey's suggestion, and by the generosity of some kind unknown, were distributed among the soldiers.
