The police say that Bruce admitted taking the chocolates to his wife, and said he had bought them at S. W Shotters, 244 York street. Bruce also told one of the detectives that he had caten one of the candies himself. Shotter, when questioned, did not recall having seld the candies to Bruce, but explained that his store was a busy place on Saturday, and unless he had some particular reason to remember the purchase he would not be able to throw any light on the transaction. The police intend to have Shotter taken to the cells to see Bruce The hospital authorities, who are willing to talk, say they believe Rose Zeipe died of strychnine poisoning, as the symptoms strongly pointed to that. Organs Being Analyzed.
