(Special to Northern Light). London, Aug. 18 .- The Express says "There is little doubt that a great battle is now going on in Belgium between the Germans and the Belgians and French allies."

A Brussels despatch to the Mail says. "Sharp fighting has been in progress since Monday morning."

That the Germans are forcing their 55 DOVERCOURT ROAD, Oct., 1st. 1913. way through Belgium is indicated by the Brussels report that German cavalry is approaching the Belgium capital, that measures for the defense of Brussels are being hastened and that the seat of Government has been removed to Antwerp.
