named. The single stickers will be divided into two clases, first including Minnie M. and the Verve of Chicago, Atlanta of Toronto, Cora of Detroit, besides three boats, respectively from Oswego, New York and Bellewills Oct. It had tively from Oswego, New York and Belleville, Onte.

The third class will include everything under 40 feet, and promises to be the most exciting feature of the regatta. There will be such starters as Marietta of Cleveland, Alice Enright of Toledo, City of the Straits, Sylvia, and Julia B of Detroit, and Cygnet of Toronto. Besides these classes there will be a race of Mackinno boats and a go, between steam yachts. There is a magnificent course whatever the wind may be, and it will be decided upon on the days of the races. Schooners to sail 30 miles and single stickers 25 miles. The judges will give a handsome purse to the sailing master who best handles his boat, regardless of in what race he may start or where he finishes. Skill and judgment will be the test upon which this prize will be given.
