CENSURED BY SPEAKER

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27.—(Associated Press Cable.)—Saved from being thrown out of the House of Representatives today by a bare margin of eight votes, Thomas L. Blanton, a Texas Democrat, was publicly reprimanded late today by Speaker Gillett, in accordance with a resolution of censure against which not a single vote was cast.

Blanton was charged with putting into the Congressional Record a document described as "unrespectably vile." He admitted before the House today that he wished to enter in the record an undelivered speech, containing the language complained of, and have 250,000 copies mailed to voters.

CRERAR HAVING SOME HARD LUCK

His Train Two Hours Late for Sussex, N. B., Meeting

AUDIENCE WAITS FOR HIM

Again Refers to the Prime Minister and Loyalty

SUSSEX, N.B., Oct. 27.—(By Staff Correspondent of the Canadian Press).—"This miserable campaign of questioning the loyalty of your opponents is worse than the Toryism of the middle ages," exclaimed Hon. T. A. Crerar, leader of the National Progressive party, in addressing electors of Royal constituency, to-day. Mr. Crerar was referring to statements attributed to the prime minister.

"Our opponents," said Mr. Crerar, "must be very barren of arguments if they have to embark on a campaign of this sort; it shows that they are fighting a losing cause."

Mr. Crerar's speech came at the close of a chapter of accidents. Yesterday he was to have spoken at Fredericton, but there had been failure to advertise and the meeting was called off. To-day the Sussex meeting was delayed by reason of late trains, and the crowd had to wait nearly two hours for Mr. Crerar's arrival. The attendance was large, however.

Mr. Crerar first took up reports of a secret alliance between himself and Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, leader of the Liberal party. They were, Mr. Crerar said, part of the campaign of misrepresentation.

"From first to last," he added, "they are a tissue of misstatement—I was going to say a tissue of falsehoods, and that would not be too strong a word to use."

Government supporters had gone around the country, Mr. Crerar said, claiming that the Progressives intended to put a heavy tax on farms. The Progressives' program provided for a tax on unimproved land, to force speculators holding land out of cultivation,

MUSICAL COMEDY DELIGHTS HOUSE

"Some Girl" Enthusias Capacity Audience at the Grand

AN EXCELLENT COMPANY

Tuneful Melodies and Dainty Dancing Features of Show

A peppy, colorful musical comedy, particularly strong in its dancing and comedy features, with a chorus much better than that ordinarily seen with a road attraction—that is "Some Girl," which opened a three-day engagement at the Grand last evening to a capacity audience. Patients and staff of Westminster Hospital were present as the guests of the management and enjoyed the performance immensely.

"Some Girl" contains no more plot than most musical comedies, but it is smart and full of ginger. The various numbers run with the smoothness and finish that tell of long road association, and the chorus possesses freshness and spirit, which adds to the enjoyment of its work.

The piece has a fairly fable flavor, romantic enough to fit with Grimm tales, and suiting admirably for the introduction of jingly, sprightly music and a succession of new, crackling comedy situations to ward against any possible serious moment of contemplation. Miss Gudrun Walberg, pretty and most graceful, a dancer from the tips of her tiny toes through her supple little body to her head, is well suited in the character of Babette, the little Brittany girl, with "sunshine in her feet." She has a sweet voice, though not of particular power, but has a particularly winsome stage presence. She literally dances her way into the affections of her audience, and her work last evening was much appreciated and heartily applauded. Allen Carter is the tenor of the organization. He is a voice of particular tone quality and much range. His solos were well done and his duets with Miss Walberg most artistic.

Excellent comedy is supplied by Miss Lillie Proctor as Tillie, and Tom Crowley as Petunia. Miss Proctor has a vein of novel fun, which she gets over her little wit. Mr. Crowley is an unctuous black face comedian, who never misses an opportunity to make the most of his lines.

There are 23 musical numbers in the show, and as each is well produced it is difficult to select the most popular. The ensemble numbers are, however, specially brilliant and afford a treat for the eye as well as the ear. As a special attraction the McLaughlin Sisters, dainty and petite, present excellent dancing turns, the dainty allegro being the epitome of grace, while the eccentric dances in the last act are extremely difficult and well done.

Altogether "Some Girl" is a production that lives up to its advance notices. It makes a particularly good opening for the musical comedy season.

Hon. Mr. King Still Worried About Munitions

WANTS MORE PARTICULARS

Propounds Four Questions to Minister of Militia

SUTTON, Oct. 27.—(By Canadian Press Staff Correspondent.)—Hon. Mackenzie King sent a letter to-night to Hon. Hugh Guthrie, minister of militia, asking for full information regarding shipments of munitions being received in Canada from England.

"It has been made clear," says Mr. King's letter, "that an accounting has taken place between the Canadian Government and the war office in London, by which both at the time of the armistice and as a result of the financial settlements in July, 1920, extensive credits were placed to Canada's credit with the war office, against which Canada was entitled to draw from time to time."

Mr. King asks:

1. The extent of such credits.
2. The extent and nature of war materials which has been drawn by the Canadian department of militia.
3. The nature and extent of the credit
