

the Vacation previous to the Term in which their Petitions are to be presented, and shall receive from the Examiner of the Society a copy of the questions to be answered by them in writing; and shall then and there, under the supervision of such Examiner frame answers to such questions, and deliver such answers in writing to him for the Benchers in Convocation.

XIV. That the attendance of such Candidates for the purposes mentioned in the foregoing section of this Rule be at Ten o'clock A.M., and that the answers be delivered to the Examiner by Three o'clock P.M., of the same day.

XV. That so much of the first section of this Rule as prescribes the entering of their names in the Articled Clerk's Attendance-Book of the said Courts, and the subscribing the Declaration of Attendance required to be contained in the heading to such Book, and the reference to such Book in the Clerks of the Crown and Pleas certificate of such attendance, shall not apply to the case of any Articled Clerk attending the sittings of the said Courts, or either of them, during the present Term.

### QUESTIONS TO BE ANSWERED BY THE CLERK HIMSELF.

I. What was your age at the date of your Articles?

II. Have you served the whole term of your Articles at the office where the Attorney or Attorneys to whom you were Articled or assigned carried on his or their business? and if not, state the reason.

III. Have you at any time during the term of your Articles been absent without the permission of the Attorney or Attorneys to whom you were Articled or assigned? and if so, state the length and occasions of such absence.

IV. Have you, during the period of your Articles, been engaged or concerned in any profession, business, or employment other than your professional employment as Clerk to the Attorney or Attorneys to whom you were Articled or assigned?

V. Have you, since the expiration of your Articles, been engaged or concerned, and for how long time, in any and what profession, trade, business, or employment other than the profession of an Attorney or Solicitor?

VI. Have you, during the period of your Articles, attended the sittings of the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas at Toronto, or either of them, during the two Terms, required by the 20 Victoria, chapter 63? and if in course of such attendance any casual absence from sickness or other unavoidable impediment occurred, state the occasions and the cause thereof.
