HAROLD BAXTER TOLTON, son of William C. and Louise Baxter Tolton, enlisted as a Private with the Western Ontario Regiment, August 15, 1918, and was in training at London, Ontario, for some time. He was taken with a draft of one hundred men to go to Witling Camp, Surrey, England, to complete training. They sailed from Montreal September 26, 1918, on the Str. City of Cairo; but in the passage Harold was stricken with bronchial pneumonia, and died October 8. He was buried at sea.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mildred Tolton, of Buffalo, New York.
