SHEEWSBURY CAKES.

Take one pound of fresh, sweet butter and add one pound of powdered white sugar. Beat these thoroughly to a fine white cream. Whisk four fresh eggs, whites and yolks together, until they are very light. Mix these with the cream of sugar and butter, and add a tenspoonful of powdered cinnamon with a dash of mace and nutnieg; then add and work well in the juice of two Jemons and one brange, after which add one and a half pounds of sifted flour, and work altogether to a dough. Roll out thin and cut into cakes. Bake in a quick oven on buttered trus.
