Further Volumes will be issued at intervals of Three Months, and it is confidently expected that the work will be completed in about Fifty Volumes.

THE DICTIONARY OF NATIONAL BIOGRAPHY will include lives of inhabitants of the British Isles from the earliest historical period. Living persons are excluded. The first aim has been to give biographies which shall embody with sufficient fulness the latest results of historical research, and be founded upon an examination of original documents. A clear indication will be given in each article of the authorities which have been used, and from which further information may be derived. In later volumes it will be sought to remedy any errors of excess or defect which may be pointed out in the first. It is confidently hoped, in any case, that the execution of the work will be not unworthy of the aims implied in its title; and that it will take its place besides the completest Biographical Dictionaries hitherto published.

"We have before us in this handsome volume the first instalment of a work which promises to do credit alike to the enterprise of its publishers and the scholarly assiduity of its editor.
