How does the Canada Pavilion emphasize the human component of the Canadian participation at Expo'92? And how does Canada share its generosity with the residents of Seville? Meet "Nuestra Señora de La Guía," the school recently "adopted" by the Canada Pavilion! Commissioner General for Canada, Luc Lavoie hopes this gesture will bring Canadians and Spaniards even closer and that it will last well beyond Expo'92. Approximately 90 children between the ages of 4 and 11 attend the school and all of them are excited about the "adoption." They have already met a real-life RCMP constable and expect many other special activities during Expo'92. For example, they will get guided tours at the Pavilion, participate in a pen pal program with an Ottawa school and see Canadian artists who will be performing at the Pavilion. Activities for the Spanish school are also being organized from Canada. Already, 23 students from Samuel Genest, an Ottawa high school, have presented the school with a gift of \$400 during a recent visit and the hosting staff brainstormed to find fundraising ideas.



Although the pre-show was largely inspired by the one used at the Canada Pavilion in Brisbane'88, Credo Group of Winnipeg was hard at work revamping the original score. In effect, they were looking at a more stirring piece of music, one that would grab the visitor emotionally and stay with them, even after their visit .



The NFB also created a memorable musical masterpiece. Eldon Rathburn had been commissioned to score the cinematographic premiere, an IMAX film which introduces its 48 frames per second as opposed to the conventional 24 fps. The new super clarity images of the film required a special musical score.

And the winners were...Juan Correa and Enrique Panera who received an early preview of the Canada Pavilion theme, Explore Canada, Explore a New World. For a week in mid-February they visited Montreal and Ottawa for activities which included skating, downhill skiing and festivities at Ottawa's Winterlude and the Valcourt, Québec Grand Prix. They even had a few words with Prime Minister Brian Mulroney. If they ever think that it was all a dream, they can take out the videotape in which they were interviewed by CJOH-TV in Ottawa and see that they were really in Canada.
