NATO PROPOSAL TO STOCKHOLM CONFERENCE

The Honourable Allan J. MacEachen, Deputy
Prime Minister and Secretary of State for External Affairs,
announced that at the Stockholm Conference this morning
Canada and fifteen other members of the North Atlantic
Alliance sponsored a proposal calling for the adoption
of a set of Confidence- and Security-Building Measures
(CSBM) which they believe will enhance mutual confidence
throughout Europe. Formally presented by the representative of Turkey on behalf of the Alliance, the proposal
calls for measures which would facilitate the exchange of
basic military information, give early notice of a wide
range of military activities, require mandatory exchanges
of observers and establish ways to verify any agreements
reached.

In his speech to the Conference last Wednesday, January 18, Mr. MacEachen indicated that the Western group of nations would present such a package of proposals at an early date and he urged the Conference to approach its task with the sense of urgency which the present international situation demands.
