Mr. PUGSLEY: I was paired with the hon. member for Thunder Bay and Rainy River (Mr. Carrick). Had I voted, I would have voted for the amendment.

Mr. DUGALD STEWART: I was paired with the hon. member for Cape Breton North and Victoria (Mr. McKenzie). Had I voted I would have voted against the amendment.

Mr. SPEAKER: The question is on the main motion.

Mr. ARTHUR B. COPP (Westmorland): I am sure that during the debate on this Bill, hon. members must have been impressed with the fact that all were of one mind with regard to the main question—the duty and the intention of Canada to assist in every way within her power to assist our allies in the great struggle in which we are engaged.

Mr. SPEAKER: I understand that the hon. member is speaking on the main motion?

Mr. COPP: Yes. It seems to me that the only line of cleavage between those who differ in this debate is on the question whether this Bill affords the best means of bringing our greatest force to the assistance of the Allies.
