SHERBROOKE POST OFFICE INSPECTOR

Mr. TOBIN:

1. Was any Order in Council passed by the late government, abolishing the position of post office inspector at Sherbrooke, Quebec?
2. If so, when, and why?
3. Was the said Order in Council later rescinded?
4. If so, when and why?
5. How many persons are now employed in the office of the post office inspector at Sherbrooke, Quebec?
6. What are their names and what salary do they receive?
7. Where did each of the said employees reside prior to their appointment?

Hon. Mr. MURPHY:

1, 2, 3, and 4. No Order in Council was passed specifically rejecting or abolishing position of post office inspector at Sherbrooke, but a general Order in Council was passed by which all inspectors were abolished and their duties merged with other duties to make up the work of the proposed District Superintendents of Postal Service. Under this Order in Council the Griffenhagens abolished the post office inspectorate of Sherbrooke and established twelve district superintendents throughout the country leaving some inspectors under the name of Post Office Inspector as a branch of the District Superintendent's office at the more important points, and under this, Mr. Dastous, Post Office Inspector, was left in charge of the Sherbrooke division, and his staff removed to other points, and the staff was restored by order of Hon. Mr. Belley and the Sherbrooke office opened with its former status as an independent inspectorate.
