

23.—Upon the organization of any other Faculty or Faculties, there shall be granted therein such Degrees as by Statute in that behalf shall hereafter be ordained.

24.—Graduates of other Universities, desirous of admission to the like Degree in this University, may be so admitted by the Corporation; due inquiry being first made as to their moral character and sound learning, and opportunity given to the several Faculties, or the Committee on Graduate Studies, as may be required, to make such representations in the premises as they may see fit. Provided always, that (except in the case of candidates proceeding to a higher Degree), such admission shall not be put to vote until after three months' notice, unless by unanimous consent, and shall not be ordered, if as many as five members of the Corporation shall vote against it.

25.—Honorary Degrees may be granted by the Corporation to any persons who may be considered worthy of such distinction; due enquiry being first made, and opportunity given to the several Faculties to make such representations in the premises as they may see fit. Provided always, that, unless by unanimous consent, the motion to grant such Degree shall not be put to vote until after three months' notice, and shall not be ordered, if as many as five members of the Corporation shall vote against it.

26.—The fees for all Degrees shall be such as from time to time shall be fixed by the regulations of the Corporation. Such fees shall always be deposited with the proper officer before a Degree is conferred; and no diploma shall be given until the Degree shall have been conferred.

27.—Degrees in Course may always be refused, if the conduct or character of the candidate be open to objection.
