

shall be locked up, and no part of the Furniture be removed therefrom.

FIFTH.—The said Master General and Board of Ordnance, may if they think fit, and when it in no shape interferes with, or straightens the accommodation of the Men (permit, as an occasional indulgence, and as tending to promote cleanliness, and the convenience of the Soldiers,) Four Married Women per Troop or Company of Sixty Men, and Six per Troop or Company of One Hundred Men to be resident within the Barracks, but no Article on this Account shall be furnished by the Barrack-Master, except Bed and Bedding for the regulated number of Women.—And if the Barrack-Masters perceive that any mischief or damage arises from such Indulgence, the Commanding Officer shall, on their representation, displace such Women—nor shall any Dogs be suffered to be kept in the Rooms of any Barrack or Hospital.

SIXTH.—Where Kitchens are provided for the Soldiers, they shall not be allowed to dress their provisions in any other places.
