A BY-LAW,

RELATING TO

WATER WORKS FOR THE CITY OF HAMILTON.

Whereas, BY AN ACT PASSED BY THE PROVINCIAL PARLIAMENT of CANADA, in the Sessions held in the nineteenth and twentieth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act to enable the City of Hamilton to construct Water Works, to provide means for defraying the expenses thereof." It is among other things enacted, that the said Act should not have any force or effect until the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commonalty of the City of Hamilton should pass a By-Law, authorising the construction of the said Water Works, and on the said By-Law being passed, it should be lawful for the Mayor of the said City, and he is thereby authorized, and required to issue his warrant to the Returning Officer for each Ward in the said City for the then next preceding Election for Aldermen and Councillors, requiring the said returning officer to proceed to the election of one Water Commissioner for each Ward in the said City, in the same manner, in all respects, and giving the same notices as are now required in case of Municipal Elections in the said City, and all persons authorized to vote
