


WHEN THE townsite of Mirror was laid out, every natural feature
was taken advantage of to combine business facilities and residential attractiveness.

By referring to the map on the second page of this booklet, it will be noted that the railway station, shops, yards and round-house will be in a group in the western portion of the town. Lake Street running east and west, and Lois Avenue running north and south, are the principal business streets. From points one block north and south of the intersecting point of these two thoroughfares, two broad boulevards have their beginning. Areas have been reserved for parks, municipal buildings, churches, schools and market, while blacksmith shops, livery stables and similar business enterprises will be restricted to a certain area.

As before stated, the entire townsite is higher than the surrounding country, and home-builders will be quick to appreciate the magnificent views the lake, valley and the hills to the westward afford. Clumps of trees also add greatly to the charm of the site selected for Mirror as they do to the charm of the surrounding country.
