WESLEY HUNTERS FORMING UNION

Appointment of Rev. George Jackson to Didsbury College is Still Causing Turmoil.

LONDON, Oct. 26.—(C.A.P.)—A doctrinal crisis has declared itself in the Wesleyan Church, following a controversy over the appointment of Rev. George Jackson to Didsbury College.
