

SHOW AT GUELPH AND TORONTO TOO

Managements Arrange to Have Stock Shipped Thru on Special.

AT UNION STOCK YARDS

Lack of Good Cattle Was Not So Pronounced Yesterday.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Thursday were 53 calves, comprising 416 cattle, 2113 hogs, 1281 sheep and lambs and 56 calves.

A few good choice cattle were among those coming on the market since Wednesday, and several boxes of heavy steers that have been on the market for about two weeks, some of which cost \$5.50 in the country, were later sold.

The best price paid for butchers' culls this week was \$7.50 for a 750 lb. steer sold on Wednesday for 22 steers sold by Dunn and Leveck.

Prices were reported as being again lower. The best load of steers sold at \$7.50 and another load at \$7.35, both loads being sold by Dunn and Leveck.

Stockers and feeders were selling at the lowest figures yet quoted. We saw a bunch of good thirty steers weighing 925 lbs. each that sold at \$5.35. Milkers and springers sold at unchanged values.

Veal calves were reported by buyers and sellers as being still lower in value, as it would take a very choice new milk-fed calf to realize \$8.

Some of the hogs sold at as high prices as on Wednesday, but more of them at lower values. Butchers' Cattle.

Sheep and Lambs. Sheep, ewes, sold at \$5 to \$6.75 for light and heavy ewes at \$3.50 to \$4; culls at \$2 to \$3; choice lambs at \$7.50 to \$8; heavy lambs at \$6.50 to \$7; cull lambs at \$5.50 to \$6.

Hogs. Selects fed and watered, \$7.75 to \$7.90; and \$7 to \$8.15 weighed out; \$7.50 to \$7.75 for 750 lb. carcass country points.
