

each stated meeting the condition of such members, and in such cases as they may deem necessary, they may suggest to the lodge such pecuniary assistance as they believe is needed. Each member of the lodge, previous to the stated meeting of the lodge, shall be subject to the orders of the Master Workman in attending to sick or disabled members, and should any member fail or neglect to perform such duty, having been notified by the Master Workman, he shall, for each neglect or failure, be fined a sum not less than one dollar.

SEC. 46. Each member of the lodge shall pay into the funds thereof, as dues, such sums as shall be prescribed by the By-Laws of the lodge, to commence with the date of his receiving the third (or M. W.'s) degree.

SEC. 47. Any member who neglects or refuses to pay the dues as fixed by the By-Laws of the lodge, for the period of three months, shall not be entitled to vote, and shall be disqualified from holding office. And if neglecting or refusing to pay for the period of six months, he shall be reported to the lodge by the Financier, and the Master Workman shall, unless otherwise directed by the lodge, thereupon declare such member suspended from the Order.

SEC. 48. Any member who has been suspended from all the benefits and privileges of the Order by reason of non-payment of dues, or arrearages of Beneficiary Fund, applying to be reinstated, shall pay the amount he was in arrears at the date of his suspension, and shall conform to all requirements of the article of the Constitution on Beneficiary Fund. He shall apply in writing to be reinstated, which application shall be referred to a committee of three, whose duty it shall be to investigate his character and fitness for membership, and report their opinion in writing, at a sub-
