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WILD TALK BY IRISH LEADER

ON HOME RULE FOR IRISH

Dillon Says Govt. Has Not the Intention of Introducing Bill.

ATTACKS COMPUSSION

Declares British Have Started Anti-Irish Propaganda in United States.

Dublin, May 17.—At a meeting of 35 members of the Irish party here today, the Irish Nationalist leader, John Dillon, presiding, a statement was issued to the effect that the bill for Home Rule in Ireland was adopted by parliament largely under the pressure that no attempt would be made to use the power until a responsible Irish Government and an Irish parliament were called into existence. The latest developments, he said, led to the conviction, the statement that the Government has no intention of producing any bill whatever, and that all the promises made were intended simply for the purpose of deceiving the House of Commons, the British public and above all, the American Government, the American people and the Allied nations, and of justifying the cause of Ireland in their eyes.

Calls It Outrage.

The statement goes on to say that the Government would not only an outrage of national dignity, but a breach of faith. The complaint is made that British propaganda is creating prejudice against Ireland in America, and an appeal is made to the United States to listen to Ireland's case as stated by Irishmen qualified to speak in her behalf.

We beg of the American people and Government, in the memory of the bonds of sympathy which have existed between the American and Irish nations since the foundation of the republic to urge upon their British allies the duty of immediately applying in the case of Ireland, these principles of democratic freedom and national self-determination so consistently set forth in President Wilson's declarations, the benefit of which is denied to Ireland while the Irish people are called on to fight for them in foreign lands.

WAIT PANESE BOARD OF CONTROL

TO TALK PURCHASE WITH RAILWAY BOARD

Debates L. and L. E. Railway Question Today.

MAYOR FAVORS PURCHASE

Opposes Any Interest Guarantee Proposition—Full Discussion Later.

The board of control, with Ald. F. E. Harley, chairman of the finance committee, will arrange a meeting with the question of purchasing the London and Lake Erie Transportation Company line. This was decided after considerable discussion at the meeting of the board of control today.

Certain members of the board thought that the city should be asked to confer with the city in connection with the purchase of the line. Others favored going into the case solely as a city proposal.

Controller E. S. Little asked if there might be any communication with other municipalities.

Controller J. M. Moore thought that it would be better to get the representatives of other centres together, keep the railway going.

St. Thomas was anxious to purchase the line from St. Thomas to Port Stanley, and it was suggested that the city should purchase it with its city service.

Controller Little suggested that the county put up a certain amount of the purchase price and the city the balance, and that the city should be asked to confer with the city in connection with the purchase of the line.

The opinion was that the road could be run in conjunction with the L. and E. R. R. at little extra cost.

The question will be brought up at a joint meeting with the commission.
