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SEE INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITY GROW

U. S. Reserve Board, However, Says No Material Improvement Yet.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 31.—Industrial operations in the United States have not increased sufficiently to effect a material improvement in the widespread unemployment prevalent a month ago, according to the review of industrial and financial conditions for January, issued tonight by the federal reserve board.

A slight increase in the activity of leading New England industries during the month has been noted, but the measure of relief there, the review said, is not sufficient to offset the situation in the south and west where the situation has become more acute.
