

The Lincoln Mills (flouring) have five runs of stones and a capacity of 180 barrels a day. James Norris.

The Welland Canal Mills (flouring) have seven runs of stones and a capacity of 300 barrels a day. James Norris.

Grantham Mills (flouring) have five runs of stones, and a capacity of 160 barrels a day. James Norris.

The Welland Vale Manufacturing Co., near lock 2, has been established 11 years, incorporated in 1873. Capital \$100,000. Employs 85 men in the manufacture of axes, scythes, hoes, and other edge tools, to the value of \$150,000 annually.

CHURCHES.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND.

ST. BARNABAS' CHURCH is located at the corner of John and Queenston streets. It is a frame building, seating 200. It was erected six or seven years ago, at a cost, including lot, of \$5,500. Services at 8 a.m., 11 a.m., and 7 p.m. each Sabbath, and at 11 a. m. on all saints days; service also at 7.45 each Wednesday evening. Sunday school at 3 p. m. Rev. Alex. W. Macnab, incumbent. H. M. Giles and John G. Gray, churchwardens. H. M. Giles, Edward Kimpton and Thos. Holder, delegates to diocesan synod. Joseph May, vestry clerk. Choral service by surpliced choir; Gregorian music used. Seats free and unappropriated. Extemporaneous preaching.

ST. GEORGE'S CHURCH, on Church street, was erected about 1840. It is built of stone and has a seating capacity of 600. Services at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sunday school at 3 p. m. There are 200 families. Rev. H. Holland, B.A., rector.

ST. THOMAS' CHURCH is located on Ontario street, opposite Church. It is a stone building seating 700. It was erected in 1878, at a cost of \$30,000. Services at 11 a. m. and 7 p. m. Sunday school at 3 p. m. Rev. O. J. Booth, rector. Calvin Brown and W. D. Magee, churchwardens, Al. J. Macdonald, vestry clerk, Calvin Brown, W. D. Magee and Chas. A. F. Ball, lay delegates to diocesan synod.
