Well Known Ontario Politician Passed Away at the Soo.

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont., Sept. 4.—After a long illness, Duncan Bole died at his home, on Pine Street, Saturday morning, aged 54 years. The funeral was held under Masonic auspices yesterday morning, the remains being taken to Meaford. Bole was a resident of the Canadian "Soo" for many years. He took an active part in local affairs, and was a well known politician. He is survived by a widow, five daughters and one son.

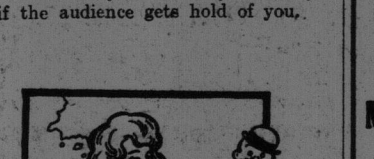
