Lyon was seen to advantage although he
had but little to do. Wm. Loker evoked
much laughter through his playing of
Walsh, while Mr. Cole, as Vincent, and
Miss Stevenson, as his accomplice in a
scheme to secure money through mar-
riage, carried the heavier parts well. Mr.
Gregory and Miss McClair also won
favor.

continue until Thursday, when "The
Gambler and the Girl" will be the bill to
continue for the remainder of the week.
