Ottawa, March 11-Canada virtually goes dry on April 1. Under regulations issued tonight the manufacture of intoxicating liquors is prohibited from that date. It is provided, however, that "in case the sale of intoxicating liquor of any class for beverage purposes is permitted in any province, this regulation shall not apply to the manufacture of such intoxicating
