

Detailed Report on Ocean and Coastwise Business Is Given.

The number of ships from foreign countries to enter the Port of Saint countries to enter the Port of Saint John during the fiscal year ended March 31, 1925 was 804, with a registered tonnage of 1,192,042 and carrying 380,119 tons of weighted freight and 75,514 tons of measured freight. The outward ships numbered 707, with a registered tonnage of 1,028,380 and carrying 663,616 weighted tons of freight and 158,946 measured tons.

Official returns announced from the Custome House showed that the total Custome House showed that the total arrivals and departures of coastwise ships was 3,755 and the total registered tonnage of these was 1,028,965. That was 46 sailings more than for the previous year and 44,048 increase in registered tonnage.


