B. Winchester on Chinese Work were submitted, and on motion of Mr. J. W. McMillan, seconded by Mr. D. McRae, were agreed to by the Synod as follows:

1. That in the opinion of the Synod it is desirable that one of the Chinese workers should reside for the present on the Mainland, and, further, that the matter of designation be referred for further action to the Executive of the Foreign Mission's Committee, in conjunction with Mr. A. B. Winchester.

2. There is also urgent need for an inexpensive building, and help for a teacher at Union Mines.

It is recommended that this matter be brought to the notice of the General Assembly's Foreign Missions Committee for their favorable consideration.

The Synod then adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock to-morrow morning in the same place, and this Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.
