SIN HEAD CUT OFF BY THE TRAIN.

A Section Man Found Lying Alongside the I. C. R. Track Near New Brunswick, Street, Fredericton, N. B.

Early this morning the lifeless body of a man was found lying beside the rails on the Intercolonial road near Pendicuta station. Between the rails and a few inches away from the body lay the head of the unfortunate man. No one appeared to know how the man had come to be lying on the track, or by what train he had been run over, but it is thought that it must have been by one of the late trains.

The head had been completely severed from the body by the wheels of the train, the cut being angular running from under the chin up behind the ear, and the neck had been crushed to bits. The sight was a horrible one, and the body was lying where it was found for a long time after the sad discovery was made.

Shortly after the body was found on the track it was identified as that of James Christie, a section man in the employ of the Intercolonial.

The four market is becoming very firm. The price has advanced five cents. The family patens are now selling at from \$4.50 to \$4.75 per bushel, and the highest grades sell at from \$4.50 to \$5.00.

Oatmeal has advanced 20 cents per bushel during the last week. The price here has advanced from ten to fifteen cents and oatmeal is now selling at from \$4 to \$4.50 per bushel, with a tendency to lower prices as the new crop gets nearer at hand.

Barbadoes molasses sells from 20 to 40 cents per gallon, and assigns brands are selling at from 32 to 34 cents.

Cornmeal is being in view of the anticipated lowering of duty. From \$2.50 to \$2.55 is being obtained per bushel. Cheese is dull at from 10 to 12 cents per lb.

Oil is unchanged, and the American brand is selling at from 19 to 20 cents per gallon.

Trout remains at the same figure. Dried apples are in active demand. From 40 to 60 cents is being paid for the ordinary article while a finer grade sells at 64 cents.

Wool is in fair demand but the price is low. Pure lard salt is from 10 to 10 1/2. The ordinary quality is much lower, selling at from 8 to 9 cents.

The regular monthly meeting of the School Board was held yesterday. A resolution of condolence was ordered to be prepared and sent to the family of the late Wm. Kilpatrick. The names of Miss Evelyn Cline and Miss Mabel Morrison were placed on the application book for positions as teachers.

Mr. Geo. F. Campbell, of St. Andrew, petitioned the board for payment of a January 1896, coupon on debenture No. 66, held by him for \$1000. He said the coupon had been stolen from him together with other papers and money. On motion the secretary was ordered to call on the board for Mr. Campbell provided that a bond be given securing the board from a second demand.

The thanks of the board were voted Mr. E. Scholl for his invitation to the pupils to view the picture Heavenly Love.

The report of Supt. Hayes showed an increase in attendance at the schools, the average daily being 4,428. The night school is still in operation, but it was ordered to be closed at the end of the month.

The superintendent and secretary were authorized to provide for the education of the children of the fall industrial exhibition. The report of the board on the 22nd inst. was read and approved.

Mr. Theodore C. Taylor returns to two friends in St. John.

Taylor, of Brooklyn, to the editor of the "Evening Gazette," he writes that he had not been at the St. Petersburg tournament last month, in which Louis Rubenstein, of Brooklyn, took the prize for the fancy work, there was a better performance than at Donoghue's. The young Norwegian, who astonished the spectators by his performance, had been the 10-mile race. He had just won the 3-mile race in 9:20, and after a short rest he did 5 miles in 17:30, and 10 miles in 32:30, knocking all records sky-high.

A New Slaveholder's House Talked of—A special meeting of the Slaughter House Commission was held yesterday afternoon to discuss the advisability of procuring an additional grant of \$200 by legislation. Gleason and secretary Magee were appointed a committee to draw up a bill, making the regulations to define the limits for the building and licensing of slaughter houses in the vicinity of St. John.
