LA GUERRE A DRAINE LE PAYS A FONDS

Causerie de Sir Herbert Ames a Cleveland.

Contrats

CLEVELAND, 29.—Sir Herbert Ames, a parlé, hier devant la Chambre de Commerce, des efforts du Canada dans la guerre actuelle.

Il a démontré qu'aucun pays était moins préparé que le Canada pour ce qui devait arriver. En quelques semaines il avait 33,000 hommes sur mer, se rendant en France. Puis peu après, 50,000, puis 100,000 puis un quart de million et enfin 500,000 hommes.

Le Canada maintient 4 divisions en France, soit 400,000 hommes, ce qui représente 1 sur 20 de la population. Pour arriver à la même proportion il faudrait que les Etats-Unis envoyassent cinq millions et demi d'hommes.

Le Canada pour cela a fait une dette de \$500,000,000, soit \$100.00 per capita. Aujourd'hui le Canada est drainé à fond et on doit nous secourir en nous accordant le patronage du travail.

Il faut aux Etats-Unis une fonte d'aéroplanes, de produits chimiques, de munitions d'explosifs, de navires: nos usines sont là toutes prêtes pour exécuter ce travail que les Etats-Unis ne peuvent pas encore faire.

Nous avons 500 fabriques à votre disposition, dit Sir Herbert. Si on ne les tient pas en opération, il en résultera une grande dépression.
