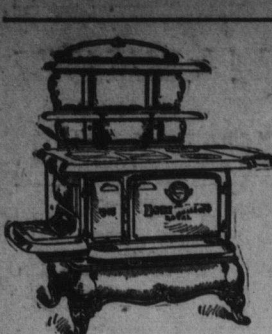

G. T. R. AND WHITE STAR L. IN ALLIANCE

Montreal, April 30. — The Grand
Trunk Railway and the White Star
Dominion Lines have formed a com-
pact which will enable them to run
on the railway and steamship plan
of the C. P. R. This fact was not
generally known, but with the pass-
ing of a bill through the Quebec
Legislature yesterday, enabling the
Grand Trunk Railway to operate in
the east of Montreal Island, the co-
operation was disclosed. Mr. R. S.
Logan, assistant to the general man-
ager of the Grand Trunk, declared to-
day that there was an existing un-
derstanding with the White Star Do-
minion Line for mutual benefit.

Under the name of the Lachine,
Jacques Cartier and Maisonneuve
Railway the railway people have ob-
tained permission to construct a line
from Lachine to the eastern part of
the island. There is mention in the
bill that the concern shall have pow-
ers to run steamships, to construct
wharves and warehouses, and to lease
or sell the road to another company.
At the Grand Trunk offices Mr. Logan
stated that the company had an in-
efficient service on the island. He
admitted that a terminus would be
built near the water front in
Maisonneuve, but had no particulars
to give.
