Paris, March 4.—(By The Associated Press)—The French government will make determined opposition to any revision of the treaty of Versailles that would modify her claim on Germany, it was learned today.

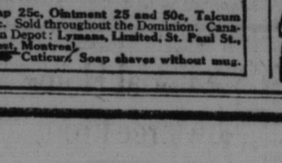
